Bishopdale – Burnside Rotary – Bookarama (new)

Bookarama is the key annual fundraiser for the Bishopdale–Burnside Rotary Club, and the club is grateful to all those whose support makes this much-loved event possible. Funds raised through Bookarama allow Rotary to continue supporting vital projects both locally and overseas, particularly those benefiting young people, schools, and charitable organisations.

This year marks the 20th annual staging of the Bishopdale–Burnside Bookarama, taking place Friday 17 to Sunday 19 April at the Bishopdale Recreation Centre (formerly the YMCA).

Since its inaugural event in 2007, Bookarama has grown into a major community success. To date, it has raised over one million dollars, selling approximately 40,000 books each year — the equivalent of three full shipping containers annually.

Behind the scenes, Rotary club members, their partners, and friends work tirelessly to make the event possible. Books are collected daily from drop-off bins at selected supermarkets and sorted twice weekly over five weeks before the sale. The result is a carefully organised three-day event offering something for every reader.

The majority of funds raised are reinvested directly into projects across Christchurch, with a strong focus on youth development, education, and community support initiatives.

Jellie Park Temporary Closure (new)

The Jellie Park Recreation and Sport Centre will be undergoing scheduled maintenance, renewal and strengthening work from April 2026.

The centre will close temporarily from Tuesday 7 April.

The reopening of the outdoor pools, gym and group fitness area is planned for November 2026, and the indoor pools are expected to reopen within the first quarter of 2027.

Relocation of Gym and Group Fitness services

Jellie Park Gym and Group Fitness services – except for Aqua classes and Virtual Group Fitness classes – will temporarily relocate next door to the Jellie Park Fitness Centre (formerly Apollo Projects Centre) during the closure, beginning on Friday 10 April. This will allow these services to continue relatively undisturbed. Thank you for your understanding, and we hope you enjoy using this fantastic space.

Jellie Park Aqua Fitness relocated classes:

- Wednesday 8am Aqua Fit is relocating to Matatiki Hornby Centre. Classes will be at the same time, beginning Wednesday 8 April.
- Friday 8.45am Aqua Fit is relocating to Graham Condon. Classes will be on Friday at the earlier time of 8.15am, beginning Friday 10 April.
- Aqua Fit classes at Graham Condon, Monday 8.40am and Wednesday 8.40am, will receive an additional lane to increase capacity.

As part of membership or multi-visit passes, you can enjoy all our recreation and sport centres.

Sport Canterbury and CCC - Outdoor Recreation Asset Mapping – Waitaha Canterbury (new)

We're excited to share an upcoming initiative aimed at strengthening active recreation across Waitaha Canterbury. The Outdoor Recreation Asset Mapping project — delivered in partnership by Sport Canterbury and the Christchurch City Council Active Communities Team — will help build a clearer understanding of the region's current outdoor recreation spaces, places, programmes, and opportunities.

This mahi will enable us to identify gaps, celebrate strengths, and support future planning so our sector can better enable participation for rangatahi, their whānau, and wider communities. Over the coming months, we'll be

working closely with partners, gathering local insights, and developing a comprehensive regional picture to guide smarter investment, collaboration, and decision-making.

It is intended for any organisation that delivers, supports, hosts, or enables outdoor recreation opportunities in Ōtautahi Christchurch. The survey should ideally be completed by someone with a broad overview of your organisation's outdoor recreation programmes — such as a manager, coordinator, team lead, or senior practitioner. It takes approximately 10–15 minutes to complete. The survey closes on the 17 April.
