### What's on Christchurch - What's On Disability (new)

The disability community have been asking for a one-stop-shop to find events, programmes and activities that are specifically for them. There has been a team from a number of community organisations who have been looking at solving this problem. So .... instead of looking on a variety of different platforms, we are concentrating them all in one place – What's On Disability within What's On Christchurch. [What's On : Christchurch City Council](#) What's On Christchurch is a Council website that helps the community find out about what's going on in Ōtautahi Christchurch. It is already well-used and supported by the community, but there is now a dedicated tile when you go into the What filter on the front page. It is called What's On Disability.

What we are inviting you to do is load your disability events, programmes and activities onto the page.

Criteria for events:

- Must be specifically for people with disabilities, not just an accessible event.
- Must be open to the public. It can't be for members of one organisation only. You can specify who the event is designed for e.g. Under 16's.
- If your event is mainstream, then advertise on the main page and specify how your event is accessible.
- It can be one-off or on-going e.g. a one-off event or a new programme starting in the beginning of the term

What you need to do to load an event (this is down the main page)

- You will be asked to create a log-in.
- Have all the details about your event, e.g. location, start and finish times and dates, cost.
- If your event occurs weekly, tick the weekly box and choose a start and finish date that you want it advertised.
- A photo or graphic (this is essential). None of the imagery can have words on it, it shouldn't be a poster with words about the event on it.
- A blurb about your event

Your events will not load automatically. They get loaded on at night so I am starting with a few organisations and then we will build the number of events over the coming weeks. Comments and suggestions welcome to help with this as it evolves. They offer support to review existing policies, set up a policy management system, and provide ongoing legal updates as requirements change. Indicative costs shared include approximately \$1,200 for initial setup, with an annual subscription of around \$2,000 for ongoing support and updates. This could be a useful option for groups wanting to ensure their policies are up to date and aligned with current requirements. Funding support may be worth exploring for this type of capacity-building work.

### **Waimāero Fendalton-Waimairi-Harewood Community Board Funding**

**SmartyGrants System** - We have changed to a new system for our funding. You will need to set up a one-time SmartyGrants login, which will allow you to view and apply for any open Council funding. Please note that you will now need to select whether to apply for funding from your local Community Board or the city-wide fund. This is an important new step.

### **Strengthening Communities Fund (SCF) (updated)**

The Strengthening Communities Fund closed on Friday, 29 May 2026. Applicants to this fund will be notified in late August as to the outcome of their application.

**Youth Development Fund (YDF) - (updated)** This fund celebrates and supports young people living in the Waimāero Fendalton-Waimairi-Harewood Community Board area. By providing financial assistance for their development. apply, please click [here](#). Please be aware that due to the end of the funding year occurring on 30<sup>th</sup> June, any applications to this fund will need to be submitted by Mid-June at the latest in order for assessment to occur.

**Discretionary Response Fund (DRF) - (updated)** The purpose of the DRF is to assist community groups where the project and funding request falls outside other Council funding criteria and/or closing dates. This fund is also for emergency funding for unforeseen situations. The 2025/26 round has now closed and will be open again for applications on 1 July 2026.
