Introducing Disabled Persons Assembly NZ

We work on systemic change for the equity of disabled people

Disabled Persons Assembly NZ (DPA) is a not-for-profit pan-impairment Disabled People's Organisation run by and for disabled people.

We recognise:

The Submission

Disabled Persons Assembly (DPA) is pleased to provide feedback to the Christchurch City Council (CCC) on the South New Brighton Park Development Plan.

We support the proposals outlined within the updated development plan to make the park more accessible and user friendly for all Christchurch residents and visitors.

In this brief submission, we make recommendations on how to further improve the plan from a disability perspective.

Shared pathway

DPA has concerns around ensuring the safety of all users.

Primarily, we would like CCC aim to reduce the risk of collisions between pedestrians and cyclists on the pathway.

DPA asks that the shared pathway is of significant width to safely accommodate the needs of different users including wheelchair and mobility aid users, cyclists and walking pedestrians.

DPA asks that the shared pathway has separate spaces for cyclists and pedestrians to navigate safely around each other.

New picnic tables

DPA supports the placement of picnic tables across the park for users.

DPA asks that at least one of the picnic tables is an accessible one, enabling wheelchair and mobility aid users to be seated alongside non-disabled people.

Mobility parking

DPA welcomes the proposal to improve vehicle parking both inside and outside the park.

DPA asks that more mobility parking spaces are created within the new parking area.

Toilets

All toilets should be upgraded to become fully accessible.

Seating

DPA recommends that seating around the park be at different heights and in the shade.

Ensuring that seating is at different heights means that disabled and non-disabled people alike can easily raise and lower themselves on and off it with minimal effort.

Tree planting

We support the planting of new native trees they will provide shade and a great aesthetic for the park.

DPA recommends that new and existing trees are managed to prevent any roots protruding from them across paths.

Protruding tree roots are a real accessibility and safety issue, especially for disabled people hence arborists need to regularly check and manage any overgrowth.

From 2015 to 2020 I oversaw a volunteer restoration project in the reserve that built on previous Christchurch City Council restoration. This was in an area close to the existing play area. After 5 years of implementing this ecological restoration project it became apparent what plant species do well within this environment.

The reserve currently contains a large number of exotic species and these provide little to no ecological benefit. Some are even quite invasive, such as the wilding radiata pine. Planting exotic tree species within the reserve will provide very little benefit to kereru, the key native bird species that have established a breeding population within the reserve.

Rather than plant a number of isolated exotic specimen trees, I recommend put resources into additional infill planting, weed control or wilding pine control of areas that have already been restored. If Council decides to proceed with planting trees as isolated specimen trees, the species that I would recommend would be totara, kanuka, ngaio. All can withstand dry conditions and eventually become reasonable sized trees, ngaio and kanuka are probably the more dry tolerant species. Restoration grade plants are probably best planted as more established plants will struggle to adjust from nursery conditions to harsher natural conditions.

I feel that the two proposed pump tracks are not a good fit for the needs of the community. As a local skateboarder with over 35 years experience in the sport I am disappointed at the lack of vision in this plan. We deserve a facility that caters for all local users of many different abilities.

Pump tracks are a one dimensional obstacle that stifle creativity and skill development. Users will soon bore of doing laps and will crave something more to challenge themselves.

We already have a large pump track in the Bexley reserve that is well built but often empty. I have been there once or twice but soon became bored going around in circles.

I have been involved in helping create a DIY skate spot in South New Brighton at the adjacent basketball court. People have contributed their own obstacles (some obstacles are not so good) to this area and this has created a meeting point for local skateboarders that is popular. It has created a skateboarding scene in our area that has been lacking for decades due to substandard facilities. We love having this in our community and with some council support we could make this area both user friendly for skateboarders and basketballers.

I approve of a small pump tracks for younger children but please consider catering for the variety of skill level in the whole community. Please reconsider the building of two pump tracks and spend some money on obstacles and areas that skateboarders actually want and would be proud of.

As a local I have seen this has attracted more people to the basketball court area than I have ever seen before. I believe using the funds for one of the pump tracks to make some basic low cost skate features and or a mini ramp such that 44 Ramps can construct would better diversify the plan and service the current and growing use of the area for kids and their parents on skateboards, rollerskates and scooters and compliment the one pump track and basketball court. I myself and other families I know in the area and abroad bring their kids with our skateboards and basketballs and use both of these facilities. The surface on court is still in good condition, perhaps this part of the budget could be redirected? This area is a wonderful sunny space away from the hustle and bustle that we all enjoy. I hope you take this consideration seriously, having the money spent on two pump tracks would be a disappointing result and I know other locals that may not submit their feedback feel the same way.

I love the introduction of the pump tracks and am all for it almost exactly as proposed, however, I can't help but feel like the local skate crew have really worked hard on improving the skatepark and using it frequently, so to me it seems a huge shame/a bit rude to not include some skate park features in the proposed upgrade.

I think somehow between the two pump tracks, the plan should be adjusted to include at 3-5 skate park features (bars, blocks ramp/halfpipe type things) around the edge or two one side.

Kids and I don't skateboard (yet) but I did as a kid and it's definitely a different skill set than a straight pump track, so don't ask me what would be the most widely used skate park features, but I am sure the crew who have been personally upgrading the skate park and using it regularly over the last few years will be able to tell you what rails, ramps or blocks are most useful. There aren't a lot of well known skate parks aside from Washington in town so if this was retained, it would create a unique destination.

I live in the house with the green roof at the top right of the satellite image with my currently 6 & 8 year olds so we regular this park weekly year round and I would feel really bad for the skaters to lose such a well loved and utilised skate area.

Something that I'm always aware of is there is growing numbers of children and adults who have significant additional needs. This particular playground for any individual who is a runner and may not have water awareness possess significant risk. Personally having taught children who are talented in escaping parents or caregivers at speed I would be thinking about how to use the paths, planting and possibly some fencing in sections. So that it limits some risks, makes it a little bit more secure. So it's just that allows greater chance in locating the individual before they hit the estuary / jetty area. Our daughter is no fast mover and will happily sit for long periods of time. However last time I went with her brother I remember he moved behind an area with trees and garden taking sometime to locate him. He's got awareness of risk would not wonder. I also Beleive that this kind of planning can also provide a bit of additional safety from any dogs in the area that maybe not controlled to the optimal level. As it can successfully limit some of the current openness where dogs can come so many directions.

I wouldn't suggest completely fencing as it would loose the New Brighton atmosphere and it's by far to big and open in space. The other thing worth considering in longterm plan is having a section devoted to dogs so they do have an enclosed space to run etc instead as it is a growing concern to many of us parents. Our daughter has been attacked by an off lead dog for a longtime she would cling to me and would not walk. So I do feel that even if it's just a big running space with trees etc that we can prevent significant injuries and enhance the enjoyment of all users by planning specifically for dog owners. It may not mean every dog owner keeps their dog leaded outside the dog park but should deter
