### **The Corner Merivale – Talk by Roger Chance on the Ronnie Gardiner Method**

The Ronnie Gardiner Method (RGM) is a cheerful, structured, multi-sensory exercise method for the brain, in which rhythm and music are used to stimulate movement, speech and cognition. Because multiple areas of the brain are activated (including sight, hearing, motor skills, speech, memory) RGM is a powerful way to improve the condition of the brain.

We invite you and your whanau to join us for morning tea and to hear about The Ronnie Gardiner Method which was developed by the American jazz drummer Ronnie Gardiner in the 1980s. His intention was to help children with their musical and motor development. However, it soon became apparent that the method was very suitable for helping people suffering health issues with the central nervous system, but also valuable in healthy aging where there is an improvement in balance, memory, coordination, concentration, energy levels and mood.

CLC is running three different workshops about the new incorporated societies laws. These workshops will be relevant to any groups whose name appears on [Company office register](#).

### **How to book:**

**Introductory workshop:** The workshop explains the new law and the four things all incorporated societies will have to do. These workshops are useful for people who are on the Board/Committee of a local incorporated society and who want to learn more about the new law and what their group will have to do.

**Write a new constitution:** All incorporated societies will have to have a constitution that matches the new law and, at this workshop, CLC will explain the wording of a free online constitution builder tool that groups can use.

- *Sat 23 Aug, 10.00 – 11.30 am*
- *Mon 15 Sept, 6.30 – 8.00 pm*
- *Sat 18 Oct, 10.00 – 11.30 am*

Anyone wanting to come to this workshop must first have attended one of our introductory workshops. This is because the constitution workshop will be difficult to understand if the person attending does not already know about the new law.

**Who can attend:** Anyone who is on the Committee/Board of a Christchurch incorporated society, as long as they are not a lawyer, accountant or paid advisor to the group.

If English is a challenge for everyone on the Committee/Board, the group are welcome to nominate someone to represent them at the session who can then relay the information to them after the workshop.

### **Services provided by Community Law Canterbury**

Unfortunately, due to the over 3,500 incorporated societies in Canterbury, CLC is not able to offer to provide one-on-one assistance to every incorporated society. This is why CLC is providing the workshops – it's their way of trying to assist as many groups as possible, given our limited resources. Most groups are finding that these workshops provide them with all the information they need but, if there are groups who want/need one-on-one help with their constitution, they could try contacting **Te Ara Ture**. This is a service that helps to match community groups with lawyers who may be able to help. Those lawyers are either free or working at a much-reduced cost. Their priority groups include recent arrivals to NZ as well as Māori and Pasifika organisations, so they may be able to help find a lawyer for group who fits that description and who needs extra support.
