We have significant parking concerns if two new courts are built. At the moment people park on an angle on the edge of Heberden Ave, blocking visibility and often parking over the fire hydrant. Vehicles drive very fast down Heberden Ave and the amount of vehicles parked on the side of the road make this issue worse. The road becomes so parked up it is dangerous to cross, particularly with small children. We are concerned about the parking impacts if the new courts go ahead.

We are also concerned about the level of community access the community will actually get to the courts. There have been some comments in the community that the Club will in fact not give access to the community. We are concerned that the club will effectively manage the community out of using the courts by booking it up for club use all the time. If the lease is granted we would like to see rules around how much community time is required as a minimum. Who will be in charge of managing the availability of the courts and making sure community access is fair?

We are also concerned with the lack of Iwi consultation for the proposal, there are significant caves above the site which are important to Ngai Tahu.

Long Text Sumner Tennis and Squash Club is a very successful and popular club with a strong membership base. I have been a member for 35 years. The club has only 4 courts for a large number of members and there is generally a waiting list to be able to join the club.

The current limited number of courts constrains the ability to manage the competing demands of junior tennis, coaching, interclub tennis as well as the various social tennis events held at the club. There is no scope to add new courts within the club's current footprint or immediately adjacent to it. In the past, the club had offered the ability for non-members to play at the club on a casual basis. Given the above-mentioned constraints and popularity, there is now no scope for non-members to play tennis at the club. There are also no public courts nearby.

Having access to two additional public/club courts on the red-zoned land seems like a great solution to coping with the excess demand arising from the popularity of tennis in Sumner, as well as to be able to offer the ability for non-members, both locals and visitors to the area, to be able to enjoy a game of tennis in Sumner.

I support the proposal to fund the construction and maintenance of two community tennis courts on the red zoned land between Wiggins Street and Nayland Street.

I am writing to provide some feedback on the proposed tennis courts located between Wiggins Street and Nayland.

Living beside the courts, and being a member of the tennis club, as well as opposite the site where the proposed courts are, I have the following points:

Although the club wants to increase the number of courts, living beside the courts, I see that they are not currently used continuously nor at capacity, so I don't see the evidence or justification for needing to extend the court numbers.

The land is currently well used by dog walkers and children playing. With conservation efforts in place throughout Banks Peninsula, why are we concreting a green area that could be easily turned into a nature reserve with more extensive planting of natives to help support the tui corridor?

Other points include:

- The club is looking to increase its court capacity to increase its membership numbers. Coupled with this, the club has a liquor licence, and I am concerned about an increase in noise that is associated with this. Just last Friday night, there was a celebration at the club, and the lights were not turned off at the curfew of 9.30 pm, instead staying on past 10.10 pm. Loud music was playing until 10 pm.
- There are often teenagers roaming around Sumner, and also boy racers. Who will police this area? We have already had incidents this year of teenagers coming into the club and being silly, which led to a ball going through the window in my dining room, which posed a major concern for our family, who use this area often.
- With the point above in mind, have the courts been set back off the road enough to avoid balls going onto Nayland Street and hitting cyclists, walkers and cars?
- Cars and cyclists often whizz around the corner of Heberden and Wiggins St, and on the other side, with Nayland Street, which is very busy, making both corners potentially dangerous with increased foot traffic and parking congestion. What will be done to mitigate the dangers here?
- Parking on Heberden Ave is already very congested on club days and events. Additionally, during the summer months, cars line the streets on hot days. Where do you propose those using the courts park that is safe?
- What will people do for toilet facilities and rubbish? Is there provision for this?
- Who will maintain the courts and the areas outside them?
- Has the club confirmed that the courts are for tennis only? Will there be an area for basketball or pickleball?
- What is proposed for the green areas?
- We have a lot of road cyclists and mountain bikers in this area. Do you propose that the pathway is shared use? And if so, is it wide enough?

Overall, I am against this idea, as I feel it could be better used as a nature reserve to support native birds with an area for a shared orchard or garden for everyone to enjoy, not just tennis players.

- With the increase in court capacity at the club it is likely that the club membership will increase. The club has a liquor licence (7 days a week, from midday – 11pm). As immediate neighbours we are concerned that an increase in membership will lead to higher levels of noise associated with socialising and drinking at the club by more people, more often.
- Can the club confirm that the courts will only be used for tennis and no other sports (such as pickleball)
- Is there any additional parking allocated? Car parking is limited; where is it anticipated people who are using the courts will park?
- Who is responsible for the monitoring and repair of damage/vandalism at the courts and surrounds?
- Who is responsible for the upkeep/maintenance of the landscaped area and lawns outside of the fenced court area?
- There are no toilet facilities or rubbish bins on the plan – where is it anticipated court users will toilet and put their rubbish?

We are a retired couple who live at 136 Nayland Street. This has been our home for the past 30 years. As the proposed development includes tennis courts on two of our boundaries, we will be the most affected by this.

After recently viewing the submission by the club to the community board we noted the speaker referring to having approached the neighbours for their input. Seeing as we would be the most affected we would have expected to be consulted. However we learnt about this proposal in The Press. After making a submission to the club we then received what we considered condescending and threatening replies. Their attempts at “meaningful engagement from our neighbours” have been clumsy and few.

“Should STSC not take up our option on the land CCC will sell all of this land for residential development”. They give the impression that this is a done deal and they are paying lip service to the existing residents. Not what you would expect from what is essentially a private club wanting to use public land.


Our major concern with this development is the amount of noise we would be expected to put up with. The proposal puts a tennis court within six metres of our house, running parallel with our lounge, bedroom, kitchen and outdoor living area, and seven metres from our back boundary. Any noise in this area is amplified by the cliffs and we can hear people talking as they walk through the area as it is.

We have a pretty good understanding of what we would be in for as we have neighbours who exercise their dog by hitting a tennis ball with a racquet most evenings which we can clearly hear. Every hit is heard even with the TV on. We would also have the noise from the squeak of shoes, which we can hear from the existing courts two blocks away when we are outside. If this proposal were to go ahead our property would be surround on two sides by a 3 to 4 meter high fence.

If this development has to proceed we would ask that no one enters the courts before 10am and that they are vacated by 4pm, and that this be strictly enforced. The club stated in their submission that the existing maximum use time per day is 5.9 hours. Any use of powered appliances for maintenance (lawn mower, leaf blower, etc) should also be confined to within these hours. This would allow us some quality of life we think.

The draft deed of lease lists the permitted use as “Tennis courts and other associated recreational activities” (first schedule, item 9). We understand that the club’s original proposal which included a pickle ball court and basketball hoop has now been updated to exclude those, and we ask that the lease allow tennis only, and remove “and other associated recreational activities” to remove any doubt or broad interpretation of what is allowed.

Given that other residents in the area mow the berm outside their properties, we would ask that clause 7.1(f) Care of grounds be amended to include maintenance of the berm.

The lease plan (page 15 of the draft lease) includes “ planted strip with potential signage wall...” but we note that clause 12 Signage states: “The tenant will not paint erect or exhibit any sign or advertising device...” We ask that clause 12 be enforced and that no signage be erected on Nayland Street.

We ask that clause 22 Smoke-free Policy be strengthened to prohibit smoking, drugs and alcohol anywhere on the property. The facilities at the club are ideal for socialising after a game.

We would also insist that the plantings on our eastern border would be kept at a maximum height of two meters to allow light into our rooms on that side of our house.

We suggest that the entrance to the development be from Wiggins Street. With the people from the six-house development at 132 Nayland Street parking one and in some cases two cars on the street, and other households in the block having up to five vehicles, parking is at a premium in this section of Nayland Street. You then need to take into account the weekend beach parking which just adds to the problem.
